Our 2024 Hackathon consists of three stages:

- Online Ideathon on 1-16 December 2023 for 25 shortlisted authors of the ideas of civic tech solutions.
- Offline Hackathon on 26-28 January in Chisinau where the authors of the 15 selected ideas will prototype them with the help of developers and designers (≈ 50 participants).
- Up to two **EaP Civic Tech Awards** to be awarded to the Hackathon finalist(s) in March 2024.







Who is eligible?

Check the Guidelines: https://bit.ly/2024-Guidelines

- 1. Citizens (nationals) of the EaP countries: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine.
- 2. 18+ years old.
- 3. Working English
- 4. Experience & skills:
 - civic engagement for the authors of ideas, and
 - skills needed to create prototypes of civic tech solutions for the technical experts (developers & designers).

Note: Residence in an EaP country / EU member state is not an eligibility criteria, but the organisers will cover the travel only from/to the EaP or EU countries.









Hackathon team

Consists of three persons*:

- 1. Author of the idea, or the product owner, is a civil society activist responsible for the idea, concept, working materials, first and final pitch and of course, for anything going wrong. (s)he gets 99% of the questions from the mentors and other particiapnts.
- 2. UX designer / frontend developer is responsible for the "look" of the prototype (i.e. user interface). Often helps the author with the slides for the final pitch.
- **3. Developer / backend developer** makes sure your prototype (and civic tech solution) works.

*If all Hackahton teams have been formed and there are a few 'free' developers / designers, they can join any team and make it a team of four









Hackathon Team (II)

IMPORTANT!

- 1. You may apply for the Hackathon with a team that will be developing a prototype of your civic tech solution idea (+1 or 2 persons, a developer and/or a designer), or only with an idea.
- 2. If you do not have a team, you will be able to gather it Day 1 of the Hackathon, engaging two technical experts from developers and designers who applied for the Hackathon individually.
- 3. If you applied with the team and your ideas was selected for the Hackathon, your team is selected automatically, too. You are responsible for the skills of your team members.
- 4. Listen to your team! They all are experienced IT professionals and know well how to create a working and engaging IT product. Cannot agree? Consult with the mentors!

Developers and designers choose the teams to work with! If you need their help, be prepared to 'sell' your idea to them!







Eligible Solutions

In short, a civic tech solution is an IT product for social good / impact that:

- addresses a societal challenge (a not-for-profit product)
- is designed for and used by citizens and/or civil society (in our case, in at least one EaP country)
- requires coding
- has a strong 'user-system' interaction (users must be active)







Ineligible Solutions:

- pure information (news) websites and pages, with little or no 'user-system' interaction (the same applies to online courses);
- pure for-profit (commercial) IT products, with little or no social value;
- websites and platforms of individual organisations, institutions, communities, projects, groups, etc., and/or networks of such organisations;
- IT products supporting political parties or candidates;

- IT products aiming to proselytise (i.e., attempt of any religion or religious individuals to convert people to their beliefs);
- videos / groups / pages / campaigns in social networks and messengers, including the YouTube (no development of a new IT product);
- seminars, trainings and other capacity building (there is no IT product);
- hardware, i.e. equipment, devices, etc.



Donor.MD web-platform supports the development of blood donation in Transnistria, motivating people to donate blood and helping people in need to find a donor.














Key Hackathon Dates



Hackathon 2024: Key Dates & Activities

EaP Civic Tech Ideathon is an intensive two-week incubation session to work on the ideas of civic tech solutions, to be held **online on 1-16 December 2023**. **Only authors of the shortlisted civic tech ideas** will participate in the Ideathon (up to 25 ideas). They will present (pitch) their ideas to the mentors and organisers, and then discuss them within 3 individual consultations with the mentors. There will be several (not too many) webinars to help with some theoretical parts and practical tips.

On the last day of the Ideathon, the authors will pitch their improved ideas to the mentors and the organisers, who will select up to 15 solutions for participation in the 2024 EaP Civic Tech Hackathon in Chisinau, Moldova.

Ideathon is the final and mandatory selection stage of the civic tech ideas for the Hackathon.






